## HABITAT FOR HUMANITY OF GREATER BUCKS

**Who are we?** Habitat for Humanity of Greater Bucks is an ecumenical group of local citizens concerned with decent housing for God's people in need. Habitat raises money, recruits volunteers, and constructs or rehabilitates inexpensive, but sturdy homes for responsible low-income families. By having the affluent and poor work together in equal partnership, Habitat hopes to build new relationships and a sense of community, as well as houses. Habitat for Humanity of Greater Bucks is one of over 750 affiliates of Habitat for Humanity International.

**How does it work?** First of all, it is not a give-away program. Land is donated to or purchased by Habitat for homesites. Building materials, tools, labor, and services are also donated or purchased. Families are chosen by a family selection committee based on need as well as their commitment to invest "sweat equity" while working alongside Habitat volunteers. Upon completion, the house is sold to the family at no profit with a no-interest mortgage and repaid over a fixed time period. These payments are then recycled to build more houses.

**How can you become a partner?** Our success depends on the support we receive from individuals, churches, foundations, businesses, and corporations. This partnership can be achieved in many ways . . . committee membership, financial contributions, donation of materials or real estate, or building skills.

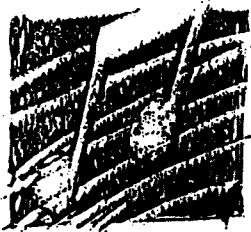

From a group of seven brave souls responding to a 1973 advertisement for "singers interested in starting a community chorus," the Bucks County Choral Society has developed into a select 70-voice ensemble with a tradition of bringing excellent choral performances to all its audiences. The Choral Society's repertoire ranges from great choral masterpieces through contemporary and commissioned works, and its venues for performances have included concert halls, museums, churches, and retirement communities.

This 20th Anniversary Season began with a highly successful European tour, the second such tour for the Society. Highlights of this trip included the singing of mass in both the Cathedral of Florence and in St. Mark's Cathedral in Venice. Featured in the Festival of Christmas Music in December 1992 will be the premiere performance of nationally-known composer Gregg Smith's *Gloria*, the third work to be commissioned by the Choral Society. Bach's *St. Matthew Passion* will be presented during the Lenten season in March 1993, and the Choral Society's season will conclude in May with a 20th Anniversary Gala of music from opera, operetta, and Broadway.

The Choral Society has performed with the Bucks County Symphony, the Orchestra Society of Philadelphia, the Festive Arts Orchestra, and the Delaware Valley Philharmonic Orchestra.

Elma Heckler, now in her sixteenth season with the Choral Society, holds a Master of Music degree in choral conducting from Westminster Choir College where she was a student of Joseph Flummerfeldt. She has taken additional study at Eastman School of Music and has also studied with Robert Page, Gregg Smith, and Dale Warland. Mrs. Heckler serves on the Music Advisory Panel of the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts and she maintains active membership in the American Choral Directors Association, the American Choral Foundation, and Chorus America - the Association of Professional Vocal Ensembles.
